Student Ambassador

Program description

The Student Ambassador (SA) Program is intended to provide an insight opportunity for an optometry studentat each college of optometry who may be interested in pursuing a career in the contact lens industry. The ambassador will function as a liaison between the students at the schools and colleges of optometry in North America and the academic sales representatives at CooperVision. The student ambassador will work with the school's CooperVision sales representative to identify and facilitate opportunities for CooperVision to sponsor and participate in school activities.

How the program works

CooperVision invites each school and college of optometry in North America to nominate a student to serve as ambassador for a one-year term. CooperVision provides a five hundred dollar grant to the student for their participation in the program.

The student ambassador is responsible for communicating sponsorship opportunities to their CooperVision representative and/or a member of the academic affairs team. They may be called upon for on-site duties, such as maintaining the diagnostic lens sets, supplying fitting guides or other product-specific tasks as needed.

Who is eligible?

Any optometry student from either the second or third year class can be nominated by their faculty.

Program dates

A one-year term that should begin shortly after the start of the academic school year. All student ambassador nominations should be received by the end of September of every year.

Enrollment process

The Contact Lens Director submits their selection for student ambassador. A representative from Professional & Academic Affairs will send a contract to the student to confirm and finalize the selection.
